COVID STATEMENT

- During the 2020-21 school year, all students were learning virtually 1st quarter. 2nd and 3rd quarter students had the option to attend in person two days a week and 4th quarter students had the option to attend in person five days a week. Students also had the choice to be all virtual the entire school year.
- Solon teachers utilized a hybrid system (teaching in person and virtual students simultaneously) and students were held to our standard Solon High School comprehensive curriculum and grading standards.
- Students had the opportunity to participate in all ACT and SAT test dates except for December 2020.
